Airports in NRW

Bochum itself doesn't have an airport, but there a lot to be found in North Rhine-Westphalia. Here is a list of them, short description of how to get from there to the site/staff hotel and how much it will cost. The cost is listed as single ticket/4 single tickets (4er ticket)/group ticket (up to 5 people). Do not forget to stamp the ticket, either before boarding the train or on the bus.

Dortmund (http://www.dortmund-airport.de/)

There are 3 travel options to the site

- 1.) Take the airport shuttle (http://tinyurl.com/airport-Shuttle-DTM) to Dortmund Hauptbahnhof/Hbf (main station) then take the Regional Express 1 (RE 1) to Bochum Hbf (main station) and from there the bus 388 to Ruhrcongress Bochum. This will take about 1h 15 min and cost 6€ for the airport shuttle and €4.50/€15.70/€17.30 for public transport. Tickets for the train/bus can be bought at ticket machines at the main station, choose price level B.
- 2.) Like 1.), but use public transport only for €4.50/€15.70/€17.30. This will take 1h 20 min to 1h 45 min. Check your travel directions here: http://www.vrr.de/en/fahrplanauskunft/index.html. Tickets for the train/bus can be bought at ticket machines at the airport or on the bus, choose price level B.
- 3.) You could take a taxi, but it is going to be really expensive (Approx. €70) and still will take about 45 min

Düsseldorf (http://www.duesseldorf-international.de/)

From the train station at the airport take the Regional Express 1 to Bochum Hbf and from there the Bus 388 to Ruhrcongress Bochum. Public transport will take approx. 45 min and cost €10.90/€24.20/€33.40. Tickets for the train/bus can be bought at ticket machines at the train station (price level D).

Weeze (http://www.airport-weeze.de/)

Don't let yourself be fooled by this being listed as Düsseldorf sometimes. It's in the middle of nowhere!

At first you need to travel with a shuttle bus to one of the main train stations in the Ruhr area (Essen or Duisburg). Best choice would be Essen Hbf, since it is the closest (1h 10 min/14 €/ http://tinyurl.com/airport-Shuttle-NRN). Then take public transport (RE 1 and bus) to Bochum Ruhrcongress. From Essen to Bochum it will take about 20 min, and cost €4.50/€15.70/€17.30 (price level B).

These last two are inadvisable because it takes ages to get to the site.

Getting there by train

Go to Bochum Hauptbahnhof (main station) and then take the bus 388 to Bochum Ruhrcongress. When you're traveling in groups, consider the 'Schöner Tag Ticket'. It's a group ticket for 35 € for up to 5 people for all public transport in North Rhine Westphalia for a day.

Public transport

The first three airports and Bochum are part of the same public transport system (VRR). You can check out its website for timetables, travel plans and tickets at http://www.vrr.de/en/index.html.
