Travel Guide Minneapolis May 18-20, 2012

Venue and Hotel information

The Minneapolis Convention Center

is located on the south side of Downtown Minneapolis, and has been home to many Magic events in the past several years, including the last Grand Prix to hit the state back in 2009 and US Nationals 2010. Parking is available on the East side of the building near Central Lutheran Church and in the lot on the south side of the building. Expect event parking to cost around \$10 each day.

The Holiday Inn Express

will be the Staff Hotel for the weekend, and is just across the street from the venue on the North side. Parking at the hotel is \$13/day for guests. There is a shuttle that runs to and from the airport at \$18, and a taxi ride will cost you about \$40 each direction. I suggest not doing either, and using the high quality public transit Minneapolis has to offer. There is a light rail station at Terminal 2 that runs direct to downtown every 15 minutes during peak hours, 30 minutes during off hours. You can use this link to get an itinerary for it and linked bus hops to the convention center: http://bit.ly/le7E30 The cost is \$2.25 during rush hours and \$1.75 otherwise, and includes transfers. Public transit only takes exact change, no credit cards. If you are arriving elsewhere, the Metro Transit trip planner at http://www.metrotransit.org/TripPlanner/Default.aspx and Google Maps are very good at figuring out public transit routes.

If you're not joining us at the staff hotel, Steve Port (event organizer) has suggested going on priceline.com or similar sites to get a good rate nearby.

Travel by Bus/Car


Greyhound and Jefferson Lines buses

arrive at the Hawthorne Transportation Center (see map on next page) in downtown Minneapolis. It's about a 15 minute walk to the venue if it's nice out, or an even shorter taxi ride if it's not. The depot is near a homeless shelter, so it's not uncommon to see a few homeless people hanging out nearby. The area is well-patrolled and quite safe. Some bus routes make additional stops.

Greyhound: Open 24h/day.

Greyhound Express: Service from Chicago and Milwaukee. Fares from \$1 and up.

Jefferson Lines: Operates scheduled services across the state to South Dakota, Wisconsin, and beyond. Jefferson prides itself on its 'eco-friendly' new coaches.



Driving from the North

Interstate 35 splits into 35W and 35E north of the Twin Cities. Follow 35W into Minneapolis and follow signs for Interstate 94 West. After making the exit (be careful, it's tricky), stay in the right lane and exit onto 11th street. Make your way to the left lane, turn left on 3rd Ave and you'll see the convention center directly in front of you.

Driving from the South

Interstate 35 splits into 35W and 35E south of the Twin Cities. Follow 35W into Minneapolis and follow signs for the Downtown Exits. Stay in the right lane and exit immediately onto 11th street. Make your way to the left lane, turn left on 3rd Ave and you'll see the convention center directly in front of you.


Driving from the East

Interstate 94 goes directly through the Twin Cities. Exit onto 11th street just past 35W and make your way to the left lane. Make a left onto 3rd Ave and you'll see the convention center directly in front of you.

Driving from the West

Interstate 394 is the best way in coming from due west. Take exit 9A onto 12th Street, and continue on 12th for about 6 blocks. The Convention Center will be on your right. Coming from the northwest or southwest it is usually easier to get onto 35W and follow the corresponding directions.

Weather Information

It has been fairly balmy for a Minnesota spring lately, with temperatures in the 50s and 60s nearly every day. My suggestion is a windbreaker or sweatshirt for downtown walking, something you can get out of easily once inside. For a warmer indoor alternative, the skyways let you get nearly anywhere downtown.

Smoking

Hennepin County (including Minneapolis) has banned smoking in all bars and restaurants. If you choose to smoke, you must be outdoors and at least 30 feet away from public entryways. And as always, please throw away your butts.

Getting around town

Minneapolis is laid out as a grid, with streets running roughly East-West and avenues running North-South. Almost every paved surface is one-way traffic; the even numbered streets run (south)east, and the odd streets run (north)west. Some of the avenues no longer have numbered names, but when they do, odds go north and evens go south.
