Lille is a city in the north of France. It is the principal city of the Lille Métropole.

Lille is situated in French Flanders, on the Deûle River, near France's border

with Belgium. It is the capital of the Hauts-de-France region.

The city of Lille, has a population of ~220 000 citizens. However, Lille Métropole, which also includes Roubaix, Tourcoing and numerous suburban communities, had a population of 1,091,438. The Eurometropolis Lille-Kortrijk-Tournai, which also includes the Belgian cities of Kortrijk, Tournai and Mouscron, had 2,155,161 residents in 2008. It is the fourth largest urban area in France after Paris, Lyon, and Marseille.

Lille's got a rich history, from 2000BC until nowadays, and this guide'll show you further the places you'll have to see!

SMOKING

Smoking is forbidden in public places (bars, restaurants, train stations, hotels, etc) but you can smoke outdoors.

MONEY

French currency is Euro. Credit cards are widely used and accepted, specially Visa and Mastercard. However, it's always a good idea

to have some cash with you (some stores don't accept credit cards). Paychecks are mostly unaccepted.

SAFETY

Phone numbers

If you need help, the emergency number is 112, like in most European countries, but there are direct local emergency numbers.

- For medical emergencies: 15
- For police emergencies : 17
- For firefighters emergencies: 18

If you call by mistake, don't hang up! Explain them that you made a mistake. If you don't, they might send an emergency team to check if everything is alright.

State of emergency

As you know, France was hit by terrorist attacks last November. Since this date, France has set up a State of Emergency plan. You will probably meet policemen and soldiers in arms in public places and in streets. Moreover, bags can be searched at any public buildings doors by Policemen and Security Guards

You MUST have your identity card or your passport whenever you decide to move from the convention center or from your hotel, and wherever you want to go. If you don't have it and you are controlled by policemen, you might be put in custody. Unattended bags and luggages will be destroyed and you may get sued. All these steps are made for your safety and the safety of others. Please, pay attention.

USEFUL TIPS

Lille is usually a safe place, but crime exists everywhere, so:

- Avoid walking alone by night
- Pay attention to your stuff, especially in public transportation and crowded places.
- Pickpockets and master thief work in team. If someone comes and talks to you, pay attention to everything around you, especially by night or in crowded places. Some teams are mainly made up of kids. Pay attention to them.
- Don't leave anything visible in your car, even in car parks. If you have a foreign license plate, try to not leave anything in your car, even in the trunk.
- . Hide your PIN number when you pay with your credit card or when you withdraw cash.
- Try to have your identity documentation separated from your money.




2. EASIEST WAY TO ARRIVE TO LILLE

BY PLANE - LILLE - LESQUIN (LIL)

Lille's Airport is located only a few kilometers at the south of the city.

It's linked with most of the other french airports, and with a lot of european places (Barcelona, Milano, Berlin, Porto...)
and offers an important number of daily flight.



From the airport, you can take a shuttle (Letter "N" on the plan) which will transfer you between the two rail stations, and you'll be able to reach the venue by walking ten minutes!

The average length of the journey is 20 minutes (without any disruptions due to traffic conditions). The Lille Airport Shutile runs everyday (according this timetable), including Sundays and public holidays; on public holidays, the Sunday timetable applies.

You can buy tickets only onboard from 8€ the single travel and 10€ the return ticket (timetable below).

You'll have to be careful, and make sure you have valid identity papers (Passport or Identity Card).

BY PLANE - ROISSY CHARLES DE GAULLE (CDG)

If your departure point isn't linked with LIL you can choose to land on Roissy Charles De Gaulle (CDG), the biggest french airport.

If you do so, CDG is directly linked with Lille Europe by high speed train (only a one hour trip). This travel is from 35€ the round trip.

According to your landing terminal, you'll have to reach the rail station (red circle on the plan)



BY PLANE - BRUSSELS INTERNATIONAL (BRU)

You can also choose to land in Brussels. If you do so, you can reach Lille from the rail station of the airport, which is located below the terminal (basement level-1), the take the train to Brussells Midi Station. There, you'll have to take the eurostar directly to Lille Europel



BY PLANE - BRUSSELS SOUTH CHARLEROI (CRL)

Flibco.com offers frequent departures scheduled to fit in with flight times. Coaches take passengers to Lille (direct) as Tickets start at €5 and are available from www.flibco.com.

Flibco.com buses will drop you off right in front of the terminal just a few metres from the check-in desks (terminal entrance no. 1).



BY TRAIN / BUS

There are two important rail stations in Lille, Lille Europe and Lille Flandres. Both of them are less than one kilometer from the venue.

Lille is easily accessible this way from London (1h30), Brussels (From 40 Minutes), Amsterdam (2h30)

If you choose buses, Lille has a Ouibus station, which is located in front of the Lille Europe railstation. Ouibus provides a lot of really affordable (from 10€) travels

Lille is reachable from the following destinations:

Belgium: Antwerp, Brussels

Netherlands: Amsterdam, Rotterdam

UK: London

BY CAR

If you wish to travel by car, Lille is directly connected to the highways A1, A23, A25 & A19 and is easily reachable from from the cities below:

From Brussels: ~1h30, via A429 & A27, no toll fee,

From Luxembourg: ~2h30, via E25, E42, A27, no toll fee,

Amsterdam: 3h, via E35, E19, E17

Dortmund: ~3h30, via A67, E34, E17,

London: ~3h30 via the channel tunnel, A16 & A25, from 34€ (30£).

If you want to carshare to come to Lille, you should use Blablacar!




3. VENUE

HOW TO GET TO THE VENUE?

Many ways to arrive!

The venue is only at ten to fifteen minutes on feet from the two rail stations. From Lille Europe, just cross the "Pont de Flandres" and reach the "Boulevard E. Dubuisson, and here you are! If your terminal is Lille Flandres, just take "Rue de Tournai" as soon as you leave the station, and follow it until you take "Rue Paul Duez" and reach "Boulevard E. Dubuisson".

There's also the "Lille Grand Palais" metro station (line 2) which is at five minutes from the venue. When you get out from it, just take "Avenue Eugène Varlin", then take the "Rue Lefevre" on your right, and reach the now famous "Boulevard E. Dubuisson"!



If you take buses, there's a bus station in front of the venue. You can reach it by taking the "Ligne citadine" 1 & 2. There are buses each ten minutes on fridays and saturdays, from 6AM to 9 PM and each twenty minutes from 8 Am to 8:30 PM on sundays.

You can buy tickets for bus and metro directly in the stations and from the bus driver, from 1.6€ each travel, or ~10€ for the whole week-end!

If you choose to come by car, a parking is directly in the convention center (24.5€ for 24h)

PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM

The Lille's urban web is really dense. It's composed of subways, tramways, buses... and bicycles!

Indeed, Lille acquired a system of pick and return bicycles (2000 available), with around 50 stations within the city, as you can see on the plan below (click here to download)! What an exciting, ecological and cheap way (1.6€ per dayl Or 36 per month!) to have a tranquil path through the city! All the informations are on this website!



If you don't want to pedal nor walk, the buses, tramways and metro are made for you!

5. SIGHTSEEING



CITADELLE VAUBAN - ZOO

The Europe of the 17th century was dark period, when war for successions and lands were legions. In 1667, during the war of Devolution, Louis XIV's army took Lille to Spanish Netherlands, as well as a lot of cities in Flanders.

During this period, an extraordinary french engineer and military architect, Sébastien Vauban, designed a new kind of fortress. None of her wall could be attacked without being under another's wall fire. Vauban was missioned to create a double line of fortifies cities to protect the realm from the Netherlands, the Pré Carré.

This is when and why was built the Citadelle de Lille. Vauban himself called her the "Queen of citadels". This 2.2km circumference five point star took 6 years, 2 thousands men, 70 thousands sandstone blocks, 3.3 million cinderblocks et 60 million brick to achieve it. In 2012, the citadel became an official historical monument.

Nowadays, you can walk freely around the fortifications. It's a beautiful place to have a picnic. You can also visit the zoo just outside of the Citadel. Don't worry, you won't have troubles with Wild Nacatis.

GRAND PLACE - VIFILLE BOURSE

The Grand Place (place Charles de Gaulle) was built from the 13th century. It's a characteristic hexagonal mineral place you'll find in the cities of the old Spanish Netherlands. In it's center, you'll see the Colonne de la déesse, which has been erected in 1792, in the honor of the citizens for their resistance azainst the Holv Germanic Empire during the sieze of Lille.

The place is bordered by a lot of historical monuments, including the Vieille Bourse. Built in the same century (between 1653 and 1657) than the Citadelle, the Vieille Bourse is the witness of the ages of thriving economic activity of Lille. It was built to give merchants a place as prestigious as Antwerp's, one of Lille's economic rivals. The building is quadrangular assembly of 24 similar houses, one for each merchant whom Philippe IV of Spain sold a parcel of the place. Here we can find all of the typical items of the 17th century's Flemish architecture: Garland of fruits, Astral Cornucopias, and richly ornamented pilasters. The emblem of the Bourse is the statue of Mercure, roman God of Commerce. You'll find in the inner courtyard book stores, florists or chest players, what a wonderful place to browse a little!





MUSÉE DES BEAUX ARTS

Due to the size of its permanent collections, the Palais des Beaux-Arts of Lille is considered to be the second largest general-interest museum in France, just after the Louvre.

The building, completed between 1885 and 1892, is typical of the monumental architecture of the late 19th century.

Fully renovated in 1997, its 22,000 m² house prestigious collections of European painting (Rubens, Van Dyck, Goya, Delacroix...), a few key examples of 19th century French painting (David's Belisarius, Courbet's L'après-dinée à Ornans, Puvis de Chavannes' The Slumber, Painter's Servant...), a large collection of drawings (including 40 sheets by Raphaël), a sculpture gallery (Carpeaux, Rodin, Claudel, Bartholdi...) and 17th and 18th centuries ceramics.

Also worthy of note is the presentation of relief maps of fifteen fortified towns in Northern France and Belgium (18th century models used by the French Kings during wars).

You may also see, until October the 31st, the temporary exhibition Open Museum ZEP (French Comic drawer)

VIEUX-LILLE

'Le Vieux-Lille", which can be translated by "The Old-Lille', is the older part of the city. Most of the buildings were built before 1850, and some of them are more than 800 years old. The cobbied ground is the eternal witness of this time. Today, it's mostly a pedestrian area, with many shops, restaurants and bars. You can also find a cathedral, named "Cathédrale de la Treille", which is surrounded by a park where you can have a picnic.

TARTE AU MAROILLES

Typically flemish cheese tart.

WELSH

Cheddar melted with beer on a slice of bread with ham and mustard. Sometimes with an egg on top.

You'll obviously find the «Classics» (ham, eggs and cheese for example), but we let you the discover all the surprises hidden in the dishes!

You can also find lots of good restaurants in the "Vieux-Lille" along the "Rue de Gand" A food court is also located next to the station Lille Flandres, in a mall called Euralille. (Subway, Burger King, Quick, Wok & Sushi, Starbucks, Paul, PeGast). Other restaurants are just in front of the station. (KFC, Mc Donalds, Les 3 Brasseurs, north typical restaurants, kebab & french fries restaurants)



SUPERMARKETS AND CONVENIENCE STORES

All supermarkets in France sell sandwiches, snacks and drinks. It's an easy and fast way to get something to eat. One, called Carrefour City, is located just next to the train station, on the way to the Convention Center. There are lots of sandwiches and take away store opened late at night in Lille's main streets.

You can find many convenience stores in Lille. They tend to have not only a great array of hot and cold snack foods and drinks, but also things like battery packs for phones, toiletries, and alcoholic drinks.

There is a big Shopping Mall between the train stations called EuraLille with lots of shops and an Hypermarket (Carrefour) 10m walking from the Convention Center.

7. DRINKS / NIGHTLIFE NIGHTLIFE LILLF

- Most of bars & pubs in Lille, and nightclubs as well, are gathered in an area between Solferino Street and Masséna Street. There are also lots of bars in the "Vieux Lille" area. They will be opened until 3am for bars. and from 5am to 6am for nightclubs.
- Alcohol is forbidden for people under 18 years old in France. An identity card could be asked.
- Drinking alcohol in public places is not forbidden in France, but we recommend you to not do it.

For all lovers of Geek culture, the "Dernier Bar avant la Fin du Monde" (could be translated to "The Bar at the End of the Universe") has been allowing everyone since its opening in June, 2012, to deeply plunge into the atmosphere of cult movies such as Matrix or Indiana Jones, enter the literary worlds of Jules Verne or Isaac Asimov, but also discover many other universes invented worldwide related to the cultures of the imaginary...

In early 2011, a new phenomenon hit eSports: BarCrafts.

The concept was simple: gaming enthusiasts meet in a bar to watch a tournament in their favorite game, have a drink or two and meet other fans.

At that time the concept was too small to attract attention and the community struggled to find locations to regularly host. However, gamers were becoming more numerous and their voices louder. That's how, in May 2012, a new place was born: Meltdown. A bar dedicated to eSports and gaming, with the goal of proving day in, day out, that videogames can be a social rather than solitary activity.

Everyday, Meltdown bars around the world broadcast the best eSports streams of the moment. To make things better, 5 to 10 computers are available at each location and events are organized on a daily basis: tournaments, showcase of a new game, showmatch or coaching session; it all happens at Meltdown.

You can drink it on tap directly at the bar and if you like it, bring it in 75cl bottles or gift hos with his glass.

Come to sing your favorite songs in karaoke every Friday from 21h: a choice of over 2500 songs of rock, hard rock, metal, grunge, punk, blues, pop, ... on a giant screen with words and microphone!

And finally you can test your Rock Culture with a Blind Test every Thursday.
