Ride the bus!

There is a city bus stop at the airport, halfway between terminals A and B. The Route 5 bus will take you to downtown in about 30 minutes, for a cost of \$1.10. It arrives at the airport on weekdays every 30 mins from 5:24 am until 11:52 pm, and on weekends from 6:11 am until 9:45 pm.

Need a Taxi?

A Taxi ride from the Airport to Convention Center will cost around \$32.00 one way.

Shuttle Service:

There is a shuttle operated by the Airport that goes to all downtown hotels every day. Cost is \$20.25 one way, or \$35.25 for a round trip ticket. More info at: <u>http://www.sanantonio.gov/SAT/GroundTr</u> <u>ansportation/Shuttle.aspx</u> They have a desk located by baggage claim.

Driving in?

The Convention Center is located in downtown San Antonio on the Riverwalk. If you come in on I-35 (from the north) or I-10 (from east or west), there will be directional signs pointing you towards the Alamo, Riverwalk, and other attractions. **The address for your GPS is 200 East Market St, San Antonio TX, 78205**

If you haven't been to San Antonio before and need specific directions, those are located on the next page.


DRIVING DIRECTIONS TO THE CONVENTION CENTER

Driving from the Airport

Take Highway 281 South to the East Cesar E. Chavez Boulevard exit. Exit on East Cesar E. Chavez Boulevard and turn right on East Cesar E. Chavez Boulevard to Alamo Street. Turn right on Alamo to Market Street. At Market Street turn right and proceed in front of the Convention Center. Just before the stoplight at Bowie Street, the Marina Parking Garage is on the left (past Marriott Riverwalk) and the Grand Hyatt Parking Garage is on the right.

Travelling South From Dallas/Austin

Travel IH-35 South to San Antonio. IH-35 South intersects with IH-37 South to Corpus Christi. Take IH 37 South to the East Cesar E. Chavez Boulevard exit. Exit on East Cesar E. Chavez Boulevard and turn right on East Cesar E. Chavez Boulevard to Alamo Street. Turn right on Alamo to Market Street. At Market Street turn right and proceed in front of the Convention Center. Just before the stoplight at Bowie Street, the Marina Parking Garage is on the left (past Marriott Riverwalk) and the Grand Hyatt Parking Garage is on the right.



Travelling West from Houston

Travel IH 10 West to San Antonio. IH 10 West intersects with IH 37 North toward Johnson City. Take IH 37 North to the East Cesar E. Chavez Boulevard exit. Exit on East Cesar E. Chavez Boulevard and turn left on East Cesar E. Chavez Boulevard under the interstate to Alamo Street. Turn right on Alamo to Market Street. At Market Street turn right and proceed in front of the Convention Center. Just before the stoplight at Bowie Street, the Marina Parking Garage is on the left (past Marriott Riverwalk) and the Grand Hyatt Parking Garage is on the right.

Travelling East from El Paso

Travel IH 10 East toward San Antonio. IH 10 East intersects with IH 35 South toward Laredo. Take IH 35 South to the East Cesar E. Chavez Boulevard exit. Exit on East Cesar E. Chavez Boulevard, keep right for three-quarters of a circle and proceed under the interstate past six traffic signals to Alamo Street. Turn left on Alamo Street to Market Street. At Market Street turn right and proceed in front of the Convention Center. Just before the stoplight at Bowie Street, the Marina Parking Garage is on the left (past Marriott Riverwalk) and the Grand Hyatt Parking Garage is on the right.

Bowie & Commerce Streets Daily flat rate: \$9.00 Event flat rate: \$10.00 Across street from main entrance to Convention Center and Lila Cockrell Theatre Located on San Antonio's iconic Riverwalk, the area around the convention center is home to dozens of shops, hotels, and restaurants. In the shadow of the Tower of the Americas, and only a couple blocks from the historic Alamo, the area is an oasis of shade trees where mariachi bands and horsedrawn carriages take you back through south Texas history.
